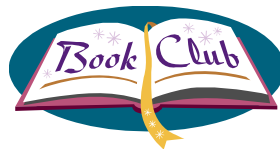
The bottom shelf of the display case houses a small display of shells and fish from several

New Book New Author!

Our own Eliza Freeman, has written a book, along with two other women, Marie Nickell and Linda Soderstrom. All three of them were dance students



of Margret Dietz, a woman who survived World War 2 in Germany, and came to the United States, where she established her own school and dance company. The book, entitled "Margret Dietz - A Dancer's Legacy," traces Ms. Dietz's life, from her first inspiration to become a dancer, to her success as a performer, choreographer, and teacher. Included in the book are many never-before-seen photographs of Margret as a lovely young dancer in the 1930s, before Hitler's rise to power. Ms. Dietz's father worked for the German government, but refused to cooperate with the Nazis,

Margret herself worked with the underground resistance movement. When she was offered a job teaching dance at the University of Illinois in the early 1950s, she left Germany and began a new phase of her life. She knew Martha Graham, Jose Limon, and many of the other leading American modern dancers.
