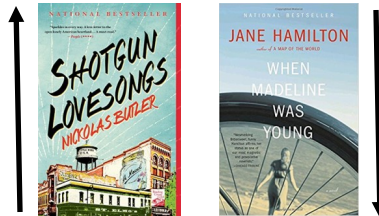
Kate is the author of eight poetry books and some of them will be for sale that night.
